Our school Aims are:


At Oak View we aim to provide an engaging curriculum through experiential learning, which children enjoy and attain high standards in all curriculum areas.

What is the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)?

The EYFS is the stage of education for children from birth, through Nursery and then to end of the Reception year.

In Nursery children are 3-4 years old
In Reception children are 4-5 years old



What is the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)?

It is based around the three characteristics of effective learning:

- **Playing and exploring (engagement)**
 - Finding out and exploring
 - Playing with what they know
 - Being willing to "have a go"
- **Active learning (motivation)**
 - Being involved and concentrating
 - Keeping trying
 - Enjoying achieving what they set out to do
- **Creating and thinking critically (thinking)**
 - Having their own ideas
 - Making links
 - Choosing ways to do things

1. Communication & Language

At the end of the EYFS (reception), each child will be assessed to see if they have reached their Early Learning Goal (ELG) in all the areas of learning.


In the EYFS we plan activities and experiences that help children to achieve their Early Learning Goals.

Use the path that goes along the right-hand side of the school. Gates open at 8.30am

8.45am

Doors open for Reception and children will be greeted by an adult. Children are encouraged to find their name and hang their coats up independently.

Sign up for lunch


Red - meat (hot)

8.50am

Doors close. If you are late you will have to go to the office to sign in.

8.50am

We all sit together on the carpet in the classroom to mark the register. Helpers for the day are chosen and the calendar is changed. This is followed by a class discussion on the days activities.





9.00am

We start our first lesson together, this may be whole class or small groups.

9.15/30-11.15am

The children experience learning through adult directed activities and child initiated learning (CIL).

Tidy up time and then back to the carpet to reflect on what we have been learning. This is also an opportunity for children to share any news.


A typical "Nursery" session in the EYFS....



Phonics



Phonics

Phonics is how we learn how to read and then write. In phonics lessons children will learn letter sounds and how to blend them together in order to read. As children progress they will start to segment words in order to write.

At first phonics will be taught to the whole class but later in the year it will be in groups.

If your child will not be attending school for any reason please inform the school by phone or email.





Contact information

Don't get it lost!




Please label everything with black permanent marker!
