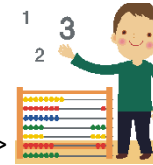

Mathematics

To count in steps of 2, 3, and 5 from 0, and count in tens from any number, forward or backward. To compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use <, > and = signs. Add and subtract a two-digit number and ones, and two two-digit numbers. Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers. Find given value, add and subtract money. To recognise, find, name and write fractions $\frac{1}{3}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{2}{4}$ and $\frac{3}{4}$.
