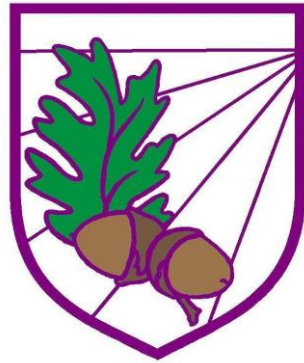


Oak View Primary and Nursery School



Home - School Partnership

This agreement was developed and agreed by the whole school staff and the Governing Body of Oak View Primary and Nursery School and is designed to enlist parental support to ensure that every child achieves their best.

Here at Oak View Primary and Nursery School we pledge to work in partnership with our parent/carer body to enable all children to do their best.

There are specific aspects of school life in which the support of parents and the effective communication of the school are necessary to ensure this objective is met.

The failure of the parent/carer to meet their responsibility in this partnership will adversely affect the ability of the teacher and staff to help the child succeed academically. We provide a calm purposeful environment which welcomes the school community. We want all of our children to feel safe and happy to enable them to engage in learning. The school environment both inside and outside must be free of any offensive behaviour. Our school has a zero tolerance policy against abuse directed against pupils, staff and parents, banning any adult who is offensive from the school site (please read school policy – 'Managing Aggressive Behaviour from Parents and Visitors to our School').

The School will:

- Facilitate children's learning to help every child to achieve their best at all times.
- Provide opportunities for parents, children and the school to work together in partnership in relation to children's learning.
- Inform parents of their child's progress at regular meetings and in the end of year report.
- Make available a curriculum overview at the beginning of each term which will give information on what each class will be covering that term.
- Inform parents as soon as possible about any concerns or problems.
- Comply with safeguarding duties in our practice.
- Listen to parent feedback (School Self Evaluation) and review the quality of provision.
- Provide family workshops to support learning.

The family will:

- Make sure the child arrives at school in time and no later than **8.50am**. The school gate opens at 8.40am, the children are registered at 8.50am and **lessons begin promptly at 9.00am**.
- Make sure the child **attends** regularly and inform the school the same day if the child is absent and the reason why.
- Attend open evenings twice a year to discuss the child's progress.
- Support the school's behaviour and homework policies.

- Support the child's learning both in school and at home.
- Agree to reimburse the school for any lost or damaged library books and any other resources.
- Let the school know of any concerns or problems that might affect their child's learning.
- Ensure that any medication the child may require is in school, is up to date and all relevant school paperwork is completed prior to administration.
- Support the school approach to online safety and not deliberately upload or add any images, video, sounds or text that could upset or offend any member of the school community.
- Agree to be good role models for the children by using appropriate language and behaviour when they are on school property.
- **Not abuse any pupil, parent or member of staff; will show respect for each other at all times including school property.**
- Respect site rules – no dogs, no smoking and no older children cycling on the site.
- Be responsible for your child whilst on site, both before dropping them and after collecting them from class.
- Keep us informed of any changes in family circumstances, i.e. address, phone number, etc.
- When driving and parking within the School's vicinity, to drive and park with care and consideration for other drivers and pedestrians (it is understood that the staff car park is not available for parent use).

The child – I will:

- Come to school prepared to learn.
- Wear my school uniform with pride in and outside of school.
- Take good care of the school building and equipment.
- Read every day and complete my homework as well as I can.
- Treat any school library book and other school resources that I borrow with respect and care.
- Follow the Golden rules and class rules at all times.
- Always respect my teachers and peers.

Golden rules:

- Be polite and considerate
- Keep hands, feet and objects to yourself
- Follow instructions (given by adults)
- Walk silently around school
- Take care of everyone and everything in our school.
