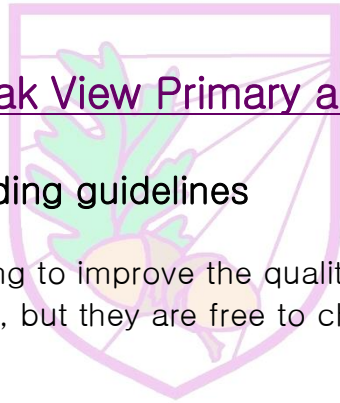


Sports Premium at Oak View Primary and Nursery School



PE and sport premium funding guidelines

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers ([Premier Sport Coaching](#))
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport ([Cybercoach teaching resource](#), [new indoor athletics equipment](#))
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs ([football](#), [netball](#), [rounders](#) and [Change4Life clubs](#))
- run sport competitions or increase pupils’ participation in the School Games ([See SSCO fixture lists](#))
- run sports activities with other schools ([HPSSA fixtures and hosting events](#))

The four objectives of the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding are:

To improve the quality of existing PE teaching through continuing professional learning in PE for teachers, so that all primary pupils improve their health, skills and physical literacy, and have broader exposure to a range of sports	Sessions are planned and organised by the Premier Sport Coaching . These sessions are used to develop teacher confidence with the delivery of sport. The coach is the lead adult and responsible for the main organisation and instruction of the pupils. Staff are given an active role within each session and build up to full delivery towards the end of a unit. There is an expectation that assessment is completed alongside the coaches to produce an accurate class profile by the end of the unit.	Staff (CPD) Pupils receive high quality teaching and access a wider range of sports than were previously available in school. Assessment team/Subject Leader	£400 per month
To increase participation levels in competitive sport and healthy activity of pupils, and maintain these into adolescence (also see Change4Life below)	Intra-school Sporting events will be held throughout the year including dance and gym displays, hockey, football, basketball, tag rugby and rounders tournaments. There will also be non-traditional sports/activities which are not normally taught in the curriculum, but which link with themes being studied. In the last term of the school year there will be a whole school sports day involving both sprint and novelty races. Older children and Young Leaders are involved in the organisation and running of events, particularly guiding, supporting and encouraging younger children.	Pupils enjoy sport through both competitive and non-competitive events. Activities range from individual to whole class, to develop their confidence and teamwork. Children have an audience for their skills and constructive feedback in a supportive setting. Small rewards such as certificates and stickers reward both participation and success. Parents may attend and cheer their children on.	Free
