# Sports Premium at Oak View Primary and Nursery School

# PE and sport premium funding guidelines

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers (Premier Sport Coaching)
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport (Cybercoach teaching resource, new indoor athletics equipment)
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs (football, netball, rounders and Change4Life clubs)
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games (See SSCO fixture lists)
- run sports activities with other schools (HPSSA fixtures and hosting events)
