

Sports Premium at Oak View Primary and Nursery School

PE and sport premium funding guidelines

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Schools are free to choose the best way to spend the money.

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers (**Premier Sport Coaching**)
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- (**Cybercoach teaching resource, new indoor athletics equipment**)
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs (**football, netball, rounders and Change4Life clubs**)
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games (**See SSCO fixture lists**)
- run sports activities with other schools (**HPSSA fixtures and hosting events**)

The four objectives of the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding are:
