#### YEAR 6 WALK TO THE WAR MEMORIAL



Year 6 pupils walked to Hatfield War Memorial on Tuesday 11th November to sketch the memorial and also look at the names of the soldiers who died in the World Wars. It was particularly poignant as it was Armistice Day and gave the children the opportunity to see the wreaths that had been laid. Year 6 are studying both World Wars and have been thinking about the importance of remembrance.

What is a university and why do people go? Do I need to go to university? When can I go to university and how can I get there? Is university like primary school? Why is learning at school important?









"I really liked how they brought different sized balls to represent each planet and the sun in our solar system," said Alessia.





Members of the School of Physics, Engineering and Computer Science (SPECS) from The University of Hertfordshire came into Year 4 and led some maths activities. The pupils learnt a bit about the invention of coordinates and then practised using them to crack a code, read a treasure map, complete a drawing and play a game.







Year 3 had a great morning with visitors from the University of Hertfordshire, who came in to deliver a science workshop. They looked at what makes a scientist and explored the different types of scientists that there are in the world. The children also had the chance to investigate rockets, learning how to build their structure and how they travel. They had such fun trying to get their rockets to hit the target.
