

At the end of November, Year 6 visited the Lincolnsfield Centre in Bushey as part of their WW2 work. The children experienced what it was like to be in school in the 1940's. They then had a tour of a typical house of the time period and learnt about rationing and daily life. Finishing the day, they attempted to put out an incendiary bomb with a bucket and hose! One of the volunteers was a child in WW2 and the children were able to hear first-hand what it was like to be in an air raid shelter during the Blitz.



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Dementia 24 and Coronation gardens carol concerts

On Monday 2nd December the Young Voices choir and Mr Barnes' choir performed at the Dementia24 annual Carol Service at St Eltheldreda's church. The event, in its 7th year, is organised by Music24, a community music charity that helps socially isolated and vulnerable adults in Hertfordshire and Bedfordshire. The event, organised in collaboration with The Welwyn Hatfield Alliance, welcomes people with dementia, learning disabilities, and mental health conditions, as well as their families and carers. The children performed the songs 'The Gift', 'Little Donkey' and 'We Wish you a Merry Christmas' to a record sized audience.

After school on the same day, children from Oak View joined forces with children from Countess Anne and Hatfield Free School to sing Christmas songs at the annual Christmas Tree light-up at Coronation Gardens organised by Hatfield Town Council. The Children were treated to a drive-by visit from Santa along with hot chocolate and biscuits.

Important allergy information


Despite our reminders and posters around school, we are still seeing children bringing in nuts or nut-based products into school.
