Holiday requests

At present I am having more and more families requesting holidays, leave to return home for an event or taking time for extended weekends.

Due to the Covid situation this has been very hard to manage, but now that life has returned to normal, by LAW, pupils cannot have time off school for holidays.

All requests will be declined this term and starting in September 2022 any child who is absent for 15 or more sessions parents/guardians are at risk of being fined for this absence from school by the Local Authority.

Why should I apply?

What are the potential benefits for my child?

- ◆ Learning mentor
- ◆ Reading Club membership
- ◆ Contributions towards school uniform and after- school clubs
- ◆ Contributions to Breakfast Club/ After School Club fees
- ◆ Extra support/challenge with learning
- ◆ English & math workbooks provided
- ◆ Loan of school laptop to support home learning

Other benefits:

- ◇ Support with raising attendance
- ◇ Social and emotional support

What are the benefits for our school?

School receives additional funding based on the number of pupils registered as FSM. This contributes to staff training, additional staffing and various support packages and is nationally known as Pupil Premium Funding.

What if my child doesn't want others to know?

Other pupils will not know which families are being supported or which children are eligible. Staff will of course be sensitive and provide anonymity for pupils.

How can I apply?

Universal Free School Meals for Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and Pupil Premium Funding

The Government currently provide free school meals for children if they are in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 under the Universal Infant Free School Meal Scheme.

If you receive any of the benefits listed below then our school could also receive additional funding to help children achieve more - this is called **Pupil Premium**. It takes **5 minutes** to register and in most cases HCC can tell you straightaway if your child can get free meals and milk at school. You will need to have your National Insurance number or Home Office number to hand when you apply. Please apply using the link below

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you don't get more than £16,190 a year)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (with annual earned income of no more than **£7,400** after tax and not including any benefits you get). This includes those who had free school meals whilst on Universal Credit before 1st April 2018 even if earnings are above that £7400 figure.

If your child is eligible for free school meals, they'll remain eligible until March 2023, or until they finish their current phase of schooling (primary or secondary), if that's after March 2023.



Lateness

We are still having a number of children who are arriving late to school. Although there has been a small improvement, we still have an unacceptable number of children arriving late. This can have a detrimental effect to their learning if they are continuously late.

If you have specific difficulties that are causing persistent lateness please see myself or speak to the school office. We may be able to offer help, advice or support.

All children should be in school before the gate shuts at 8.55am. Please endeavour to be in school on time and give your child the positive start of the day they require.

Scooters and bikes

Despite repeated requests not to ride scooters and bikes within the school grounds, this is still happening.

We have had several incidents where people have been injured because of scooters and bikes being ridden around school.

Please dismount from your scooter or bike before entering the school gates and walk them round.
