### School meal price increase

From April  $1^{st}$ , school meals will be increasing from £3.30 to £3.45 per day (£17.25 per week) for KS2. Nursery meals will increase from £2.53 to £2.58 per day (£12.90 per week). Please continue to use School Grid to order meals for your child.

<u>Please make sure that payments are made</u> <u>in advance.</u>

From September, all meals will need to be ordered at home and payment will need to be made before the meals are taken, if applicable. Meals will no longer be ordered in school.
