Attendance

Attendance is such a significant part of a child's success in school and at present there is a national issue regarding children being regularly absent from school. Oak View has a statistic of 22% of pupils who are identified as persistent absentees, due to their attendance being below 90%.

Last week we sent letters to all parents regarding attendance and the impact time off school has on their child's academic progress as well as the social interaction with their peers.
